

RESOLUTION CONF. 11.21 (REV. COP14)

USE OF ANNOTATIONS IN APPENDICES I AND II

1. The final paragraph of the operative part of Resolution Conf. 11.21 (Rev. CoP14) is as follows:

AGREES that, for species transferred from Appendix I to II subject to an annotation that specifies the types of specimen included in the Appendix, specimens that are not specifically included in the annotation shall be deemed to be specimens of species included in Appendix I and the trade in them shall be regulated accordingly.

2. When a species is transferred from Appendix I to Appendix II, this generally includes all specimens. It is therefore not strictly correct to refer to "an annotation that specifies the types of specimen included in the Appendix".
3. The annotations being referred to in the paragraph under 'AGREES' are those that specify the types of specimens covered by the provisions relating to species in Appendix II, others being "deemed to be" specimens of species in Appendix I (c.f. the African elephant, the vicuña, etc.).

Recommendation

4. The Secretariat therefore recommends that the Conference of the Parties adopt the amendment to Resolution Conf. 11.21 (Rev. CoP14) presented below.
